Morning flight to Barcelona

Panoramic tour of Barcelona including Mountjuic, a prominent hill overlooking Barcelona Harbour which played a strategic part in the defense of the city.

Columbus Monument – a 197 foot monument to Christopher Columbus at the lower end of La Rambla, constructed in the late 1800's.

Visit the Sagrada Familia Basilica, a large unfinished Roman catholic Church designed by architect Antoni Gaudi in the late 1800's. Still under construction and anticipated completion by 2026.

Touring in Barcelona

Walking Tour of the Gothic Quarter, maintained as a perfect example of an old city offering a variety of architectural and historic streets, palaces and churches dating from the Middle ages where there was also a sizeable Jewish community.

Joan Miro Foundation is a museum of modern art honoring and created by Joan Miro himself.

Mies van der Rhode Pavillion was the German Pavillion designed for the 1929 International Exposition. It's a modernist icon in the architecture world.

Morning visit to Gaudi's Park Guell, a public park system composed of gardens and architecture by Antoni Gaudi inaugurated in 1926 and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984. Walk through the winding paths with sculptures and mosaics designed by Gaudi himself.

Picasso Museum houses one of the most extensive collections of artworks by 20th century Spanish artist Pablo Picasso with over 4000 works.
